Who pays for what?



- Delegates will be provided with a one-time food allowance of \$220 (representing the full Federation Allowable Meal Allowance for the duration of Remote AMPA 2021)
- Delegates will be provided with one-time participation in Remote AMPA 2021 allowance of \$280
- Alternates will receive the same amount paid for by the District.
- DEPENDENT CARE EXPENSES The Allowance noted above does not cover dependent care costs. These can still be expensed separately.



Dependant care information

- Childcare or dependant care expenses to allow members to attend authorized OSSTF/FEESO activities will be reimbursed at \$15 per hour, OR at the Living Wage established for the community in which the member resides (whichever is higher).
- For reimbursement at the Living Wage, the member must provide documentation identifying that a Living Wage has been calculated for the community and provide proof of payment at that rate. Communities with a living wage are listed at www.ontariolivingwage.ca/living_wage_by_region
- The maximum reimbursement for a day will be 10 hours, regardless of the number of dependants.
- If overnight care is needed, up to \$50 will be provided for overnight care.
- Reimbursements will include immediate family members, excluding parents and guardians, as eligible caregivers.
- Receipts from the childcare or dependant care provider must be provided.
- If there are exceptional circumstances, contact Provincial Office in advance for consideration of special approval.

DIGITAL REQUIREMENTS

In order to participate in Remote AMPA, you must have access to the following for the duration of the meeting:

- Phone line to participate in debate, cast votes for motions, and, receive the audio feed of the proceedings
- Computer or smart device with internet connectivity capable of running the Zoom platform / widget / app and to vote in the elections using the OSSTF/FEESO Voting Centre.

UNIQUE LOG-IN

- Login Information Emails
- Each member attending the remote annual meeting will receive a unique email that will include their individual login and PIN information for the house, applicable Equity Caucuses and assigned Q and A session.
- It is important that these logins PINS NOT be shared. Regular audits of attendees will occur throughout Remote AMPA.

Who is BIRT? AMPA RESOLUTIONS (Be It Resolved That)

One of the duties we have at AMPA is to make changes or additions to the OSSTF/FEESO Constitution and Bylaws (The Handbook) and to OSSTF/FEESO Policies and Procedures. This is done through resolutions/motions.

On-time resolutions will be found in the "greens" document - the resolution document which will be available on the OSSTF/FEESO website the last week of February.

Late resolutions/ amendment will arrive each day of AMPA (the yellows).

A daily sequencing sheet will let you know the order of motions for the day.



Traffic Signals on the floor of AMPA



Traffic signals are red, yellow and green

Speaking at AMPA...

A **YELLOW** card allows you to ask a question A **WHITE** card means you are in favour of the resolution

A **BLUE** card means you are against the resolution

A RED card stops everything – you can ask for the heat to be turned up, you can ask to recognize something, you can ask to challenge the chair on a ruling

NO WAY!

In order to speak

When it is your turn at the mic you have precisely 90 seconds to speak – but first you must state your name, district and bargaining unit.

Then you can speak to the motion, speak against the motion or ask a question of clarification.

If your camera is on, you will appear on screen.



Alternate Switching Process

Because of the unique requirements of hosting a Remote AMPA, alternates will be able to change credentials to delegate (voting) status, replacing an existing voting delegate for either the morning segment (a.m.) or the afternoon (p.m.) segment of the virtual meeting only.

Delegates who require time off the floor MUST email Michelle Teixeira (mteixeira@osstftoronto.ca) NO LATER THAN TUESDAY MARCH 9 @ NOON and clearly indicate the day/ time off requested.

Such requests should be only for extraordinary circumstances.
