# **Branch Presidents Workshop**

On the weekend of October 24-26, OSSTF Toronto teachers hosted its annual Branch President's workshop. Over 80 branch presidents and branch executive members gathered at the Nottawasaga Inn for two days of training designed to support local leaders in their roles as front-line representatives of OSSTF in the workplace.

The weekend began with an important address by President Doug Jolliffe highlighting the numerous militant actions taken by the OSSTF Toronto Teachers leadership and its members and which resulted in many important gains, and



the subsequent protection of those gains since the TDSB was created by amalgamation in 1997. As we move into another unprecedented round of bargaining, work site leaders were encouraged to move forward together with a spirit of teamwork and solidarity. To that end, Saturday morning began with a series of exercises that had branch leaders and members of the Toronto Teachers Executive working together to raise money for Kids Help Phone. In all, \$1000.00 was raised. The rest of the day focused on detailed scenarios of common issues dealt with by worksite leaders. Everything from member conflict to dealing with difficult principals and building engaged branches was covered in a way that allowed worksite leaders to talk and listen to one another, and share ideas for solutions.

The weekend wrapped up on Sunday morning with a report on current legal issues relating to Supreme Court cases that may have an impact on OSSTF's challenge to Bill 115. Ethan Poskanzer, senior lawyer at Sack Golblatt Mitchell provided a detailed overview of the cases. Provincial OSSTF president, Paul Elliot followed with an update on provincial issues and a report on the Ontario College of Teachers. Overall, local leaders left the weekend feeling energized and more equipped to represent the members in their schools. See pictures of the weekend on our website.
